Magnify The Lord

"O Magnify the Lord with me and let us exalt His name together."
Psalm 34:3

The word magnify means to enlarge. When we tell God, "I magnify you," we are literally saying, "I make you bigger in my life than any problem or need that I have." I have sung many songs over the years that talked about magnifying the Lord without even realizing what the word meant. We do this a lot. We sing and talk about things we don't even really understand. They are just phrases we have learned in church.

We should magnify the Lord and that means we should make Him larger than anything else in our life. When we worship and praise Him, we are doing just that. We are saying, "You are so big, so great, that I want to worship you." By putting God first we are also saying, "You're bigger than any need I have."

Salmon Cakes

Ingredients:

- 1 lb fresh salmon filet*
- Garlic Salt – I use Lawry's brand
- Black Pepper
- Olive Oil
- 1 medium onion (1 cup finely diced)
- 1/2 red bell pepper, diced
- 3 Tbsp unsalted butter, divided
- 1 cup Panko bread crumbs (Japanese Style crumbs)
- 2 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 3 Tbsp mayo
- 1 tsp Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 cup minced fresh parsley

How To Make Salmon Cakes (Salmon Patties):

1. Preheat Oven to 425°F. Line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment or a silpat. Place salmon skin-side down, brush with olive oil and season with garlic salt and black pepper. Bake uncovered for 10-15 min or just until cooked through (my thinner cut wild salmon was closer to 10 minutes). Remove from oven, cover with foil and rest ten minutes. Discard skin, flake salmon with forks, remove any bones, and cool to room temp while prepping remaining ingredients.

2. Heat a medium skillet over medium heat. Add 1 Tbsp olive oil, 1 Tbsp butter and finely diced onion and bell pepper. Saute until softened and golden (7-9 minutes) then remove from heat.

3. In a large mixing bowl, combine cooled flaked salmon, sautéed onion and pepper, 1 cup bread crumbs, 2 beaten eggs, 3 Tbsp mayo, 1 tsp Worcestershire sauce, 1 tsp garlic salt, 1/4 tsp black pepper, and 1/4 cup fresh parsley. Stir to combine then form into 13-14 patties. I find it's easiest to portion the patties using a flat ice cream scoop then pressing them into 1/3 to 1/2" thick patties.

4. Heat 1 Tbsp oil and 1 Tbsp butter in a large pan over medium heat and once butter is done sizzling, add half of the salmon cakes and sauté 3 1/2 to 4 minutes per side or until golden brown and cooked through.

If salmon cakes brown too quickly, reduce heat. Remove to a paper-towel lined plate. Add remaining 1 Tbsp oil and 1 Tbsp butter and repeat cooking remaining salmon cakes.



Water is Life

Water is vital to our health and wellbeing. It is described as a tasteless, colorless, liquid at room temperature with zero calories. Up to 60% of the adult body is water, according to Mitchell and others (1945). The brain and heart are composed of 73%, the lungs are about 83%, the skin 64%, muscles and kidneys 79% and even the bones 31%.

It is the chief medium of plasma (the liquid portion of blood), and transports waste. It also protects our joints and the inner lining of organs allowing them to move freely without friction.

Drinking water prevents dehydration that may cause confusion, mood changes, heat exhaustion and constipation.

Water plays a key role in many of our body's functions such as bringing nutrients to cells via the circulatory system of which 90% is water. Water acts as the solvent in which our food dissolves so that it may be in a liquid form for cell absorption. The waste is then removed by the kidneys as urine. When the kidneys sense a decrease in blood volume due to dehydration kidney damage may occur. Apart from urine, waste is also removed as perspiration and bowel movements. With decreased water intake perspiration is reduced and becomes concentrated with salt. Skin pores become clogged and may lead to acne in certain age groups. Bowel movement becomes slow and difficult when water is reabsorbed from the colon, resulting in constipation as the fecal matter becomes hard and dry.

Bladder infections, urinary tract infections (UTI) and kidney stones may all result from poor water intake and excessive sugary beverages. Thirst, sleep and appetite are regulated by the same area in the brain; therefore, it is recommended to drink a glass or two of water before meals to prevent overeating, reduce calories and aid in weight loss (Medical News Today). According to the U.S. Academics of Science and Medicine, the average healthy adult living in a temperate climate needs 15.5 cups (3.7 liters) or 125 ounces of fluids for men, and 11.5 cups (2.7 liters) or 91 ounces for women. This may be modified depending on exercise, pregnancy, breastfeeding, ill health such as diarrhea, vomiting and fever. A good indication of adequate water intake is urine that is light yellow in color with little or no odor (Mayo Clinic).


Don't be stagnant in your singleness; grow and evolve into the woman/man of God that you are designed and destined to be.








Shoe Box Giveaway


