Apple Cinnamon Pretzel Salad

RECIPES TO TRY

Prep Time: 30 minutes Cook Time: 20 minutes Chill Time: 4 hours Total Time: 4 hrs 50 mins Yield: 12 Servings

Most of us have enjoyed Strawberry Pretzel Salad, but have you heard of Apple Cinnamon Pretzel Salad? Let's give this dish a try during the holiday season!

Ingredients

For the Apple Cinnamon Topping

- 4 Granny Smith apples, peeled, diced into small pieces
- 1 ½ cups water
- ¾ cup sugar
- ¼ cup cornstarch
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tbsp lemon juice

For the Pretzel Crust

- 2 cups crushed pretzels
- ¼ cup sugar
- ½ cup butter, melted

For the Cream Cheese Filling

- 8 oz cream cheese, room temperature
- 8 oz cool whip
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 cup powder sugar

Apple Copposed Pretzel Salad

Instructions

For the Apple Cinnamon Topping

- 1. In a medium saucepan, over low heat, bring water, cornstarch, sugar, cinnamon and lemon juice to a boil, stirring constantly
- 2. Continue stirring until sauce thickens, about 3 4 minutes.
- 3. Add diced apples, stir and let simmer for 8-10 minutes
- 4. Remove from heat and let cool completely. Set aside.

For the Pretzel Crust

- 1. Mix crushed pretzels, sugar and butter together until combined (save a cup for topping)
- 2. Press in an ungreased 9 x 13 baking dish.
- 3. Bake for 10 12 minutes, in a 350° preheated oven, then remove and let cool completely.

For the Cream Cheese Filling

- 1. Using a large bowl, beat cream cheese, powdered sugar together until light and fluffy.
- 2. Add cool whip and beat until combined.
- 3. Spread cream cheese mixture over pretzel crust.
- 4. Place in fridge until chilled.
- 5. Once chilled, spoon apple mixture over cream cheese, spread evenly then sprinkle remaining pretzel mixture on top of apples.
- 6. Cover with plastic wrap and place in the fridge for 4 6 hours until set.

Train Up A Child

On September 7, 2023, I had the opportunity to send my youngest daughter off to kindergarten. As this was my second time being able to complete such an awesome responsibility, I couldn't help but to think about how different the world is now than it was back in 2006 when I took my eldest daughter to kindergarten.

Not just the world, but also myself. The mother, the person I was back then, is far different from the mother and person I have become in the present day. I reminisced on all the mistakes and the journey of life that my eldest daughter would partake with me. What was I teaching her I thought. How did it influence the person she is now at 22 years of age? But He said to me, "my grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Corinthians 12:9) By God's grace I must admit the eldest turned out pretty good considering what I taught her (what I showed her).

But how can you train anyone if you are refusing the training that will heal you from all your sins.




Our Compassionate God


Thanksgiving Blessing

Holiday Health and Safety Tips

- 1. Frequently wash your hands to help stop the transmission of germs. Wash your hands with soap and clean running water for at least 20 seconds.

- 5. Avoid secondhand smoke. Smokers have greater health risks because of their tobacco use.
- 6. **Get your vaccinations.** Vaccinations help prevent diseases and save lives. Everyone 6 months and older should get a flu vaccine each year.
- 7. **Practice fire safety.** Most residential fires occur during the winter months, so don't leave fireplaces, space heaters, food cooking on stoves, or candles unattended. Have an emergency plan and practice it regularly.

Above all, don't forget to Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I will say, rejoice. (Philippians 4:4)


Financial Planning
